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Definitions

- "Number of Students Who Began Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length with the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancelation period.
- "Students available for graduation" is the number of students who began program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-Time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program with 100% of the program length with in the reported calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program. (Includes on-time graduates)
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation.
- "Graduates available for employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- "Graduates unavailable for employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United State or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- "Graduates employed in the field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documents verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six-month period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after the student completes an applicable educational program.



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- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- "Number of Students Taking Exam" is the number of students who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after the students completed the program.
- "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of students who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported exam.
- "Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- "Salary" is as reported by the graduate or graduate's employer.
- "No Salary Information Reported" is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.



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STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

You have the right to cancel this agreement for a course of instruction including any equipment such as books, materials and supplies or any other goods related to the instruction offered in this Agreement, through attendance at the first-class session, or the seventh day after enrollment whichever is later for a refund of the "tuition" amount. Cancellation shall occur when you give written notice of cancellation at the address of the School shown on the top of the first page of the Enrollment Agreement. You can do this by mail, hand delivery or fax. The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with postage prepaid. If you cancel this Agreement, the School will refund any money that you paid, less any deduction for equipment not timely returned in good condition, within thirty days after your Notice of Cancellation is received. The institutional refund policy for students who have completed 60 percent or less of the course of instruction shall be a pro rata refund.

If you withdraw from the course of instruction after the period allowed for cancellation of the Agreement, which is until midnight of the first business day following the first class you attended, the School will remit a refund less a registration fee, if applicable not to exceed \$98.00 within thirty days following your withdrawal. You are obligated to pay only for educational services rendered and for unreturned equipment. The refund shall be the amount you paid for instruction multiplied by fraction, the numerator of which is the number of hours of instruction which you have not received but for which you have paid, and the denominator of which is the total number of hours of instruction for which you paid.

IF THE AMOUNT YOU HAVE PAID IS MORE THAN THE AMOUNT YOU OWE FOR THE TIME YOU ATTENDED, THEN A REFUND WILL BE MADE WITHIN THIRTY DAYS OF WITHDRAWAL. IF THE AMOUNT THAT YOU OWE IS MORE THAN THE AMOUNT THAT YOU HAVE PAID, THEN YOU WILL HAVE TO MAKE ARRANGEMENTS TO PAY FOR IT.

Students whose tuition and fees are paid by a third-party organization (federal financial aid, etc.) are entitled to a refund of moneys not paid by the third-party organization (i.e federal financial aid, etc.).
